The Liberal Democrat's chief whip at Westminster, Alistair Carmichael, has also been appointed deputy party leader in Scotland.

As Chief Whip for the wee "partner" in the UK Coalition he has admitted that he fails to measure up to his opposite number in the Tories who has received widespread Con/LD admiration for describing the London polis as "fu**ing plebs" who needed to "learn their place".
